We will use a website called IXL in our classrooms again this year. IXL is a comprehensive learning program offering unlimited math, language arts, so-cial studies, Spanish, and science practice across thousands of skills—all of which are aligned to state standards. One of the best things about IXL is that your child can access it from home, so you have a chance to see your child's progress! IXL is designed to help your child learn at his or her own pace. The program is adaptive and will adjust based on your child's demonstrated understanding of the material. All your child's results will be saved, so you can monitor his or her progress anytime by clicking on Analytics. For on-the-go practice, you can download IXL's free tablet apps for iPad, Android, or Kindle and sign in with your child's username and password. With thousands of interactive skills, IXL is a fun way for your child to keep their learning fresh and also review skills they may need additional help to master. IXL has provided a Parent Guide video for your reference.

Facts Tuition Management

Incidental Billings for items such as Extended Care, Band and Athletics are now being invoiced through FACTS accounts. Please note that if you did not turn on the <u>auto pay</u> feature for incidental billings, you will need to log into your FACTS account and process a payment manually.

Prepay is another feature that the School will be using. Currently, parents of 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students are able to log into their FACTS account and pay the \$10 admission fee for the **Middle School Dance** (see more information in this week's KC for the date of the dance).

Counseling Corner

I hope your week is going well, and you're able to regain some normalcy back post-hurricane! As Louisianians, we know natural disasters, especially hurricanes and floods, all too well. The stress and anxiety triggered by these events can be difficult to cope with, even as adults. It might make you wonder what thoughts and feelings your kid(s) are internalizing.

For children, mild changes in behavior are "normal" after a natural disaster. Some common behaviors include clinginess and fear of separation, increased sensitivity/fear surrounding rain/thunderstorms, change in sleep patterns (not wanting to sleep in bed/room alone), physical complaints such as headache and stomachache, preoccupation with storms or hurricanes, change in school performance, and concerns and worries about the safety of

loved ones and pets. I have included two resources below that you may find beneficial during this time.

As always, I am here to help all SAS students and their families in any way that I can. If you think your child would benefit from extra support via individual counseling, please complete the counseling referral form on the school website. Lastly, please do not hesitate to contact me if your child presents with concerning behaviors or exhibits any of the behaviors previously listed for an extended amount of time.
