#### Requests/Student Dismissal Calls

The office phones and lobby can be very busy, especially at arrival and dismissal times. We want to ensure that homework requests and dismissal notes are processed in a timely manner. If you need to request homework or let your child know the method for going home in the afternoon, please make these calls early in the day. We cannot guarantee that your child's teacher or your child will receive the message if you call after 2:30 in the afternoon. We appreciate your help with this.

#### PM Carpool

Pink signs=PK3 families (pick up is at the classroom area)

Green signs= PK4 and K families (front carpool)

Orange signs= 1st-8th (bus port rear carpool)

If your PK4 or Kindergarten child is absent and an older sibling is at school, please pick that sibling up in front carpool as usual. This keeps the signs consistent with the areas designated for grade levels.

On **rainy day** carpool, PK3 parents will pull out of the line to be near the classroom/gym area for drop off or pick up.

Official signs are necessary for pick up in carpool. This is for the safety of all students and will be enforced. If you forget or lose the official sign, please come to the school office to get one printed. We appreciate everyone's help to keep our drop of and dismissal safe for everyone.

Dear Parents and Students,

This is the time of year when the St. Alphonsus Band invites new beginners to join our program. Students who join our Band will learn how to play an instrument, read music, and perform as an ensemble.

The decision of whether to join the school band is an important one. There are many advantages to learning music, and playing in a band in particular. Here are some of these benefits:

- Students who play a band instrument for two or more years score 10 percentile points higher in reading and 12 percentile points higher in language on average than their non-band peers.
- Band students score an average of 62 points higher on SAT tests.
- High school music students have a higher grade point average than other students in the same school
- Of those who apply to medical school, 66% of music majors are admitted, higher than any other group, including biochemistry majors.
- Group music activities help social skills by teaching students to form a commitment, work together toward a goal, and form a bond with their peers.

The earlier your child gets involved in playing a musical instrument, the greater the potential benefit both academically and socially. For this reason, our band program is open to children as young as 4<sup>th</sup> grade.

Please talk to your son or daughter about Band, and consider enrolling your child in this program. The Beginner group meets on Tuesday, Thursday, and every other Friday mornings at 7:15. Semester tuition is \$150 for the Fall and \$200 for the Spring, and your child will need to rent an instrument from Music and Arts (formerly Zeagler's Music) or another music store.
