

**Please note that all dress days are optional. Students may wear regular spirit dress or regular school uniforms if they do not wish to participate in the specific Red Ribbon dress day.

The Red Ribbon organization serves as a catalyst to mobilize communities to educate youth and encourage participation in drug prevention activities. This year our Red Ribbon Week will be held from October 20th -October 24th. During this week, we will have various dress days and activities for the

students.

October 20th - "Don't Get Mixed Up with Drugs" Wacky Tacky Day

Students may wear:

- Mismatched, silly, or clashing clothing
- Crazy socks, mixed patterns, and fun accessories are encouraged.
- Clothing must be school-appropriate (no midriffs, short shorts, or inappropriate graphics).

October 21st - "Too Bright for Drugs" Neon Day

- Students may wear bright neon shirts, pants, or accessories.
- Sunglasses and glow accessories are allowed (not during class instruction).
 - Apparel must remain modest and school-appropriate.

October 22nd - "Follow Your Dreams, Don't Do Drugs" - PJ Day

- Students may wear pajamas, robes, and slippers.
- Pajamas must be modest (loose fitting pajama bottoms only, no nightgowns).
 Students must wear sneakers /closed-toe shoes for safety (slippers can be brought for inside).

October 23rd - "We are RED-y to Say No to Drugs" - Red Spirit Day

- Students should wear a red shirt with uniform bottoms or spirit dress bottoms.
- Red socks, bows, and accessories encouraged; no face paint or hair dye.

October 24th - "Hornets Run from Drugs" Hornet Run Day

- Students should wear their Hornet Run shirt with SAS-approved PE shorts or uniform bottoms.
 - Sneakers are required for running/walking.


