




Counselor's CORNER

A Note from Ms. Morgan

This Thanksgiving, I'm especially thankful for our wonderful students and the amazing school community we are a part of. Spending each day with your children and helping them grow socially and emotionally is a blessing.

In our guidance classes, pre-k and kindergarteners have been learning to recognize their big feelings and express them in healthy ways. First graders learned the difference between tattling and telling, and when it's important to speak up. In second grade, we talked about "awesome actions" and how to avoid "bummer behaviors." Third graders have been all about kindness and what it means to be a good friend. Our fourth graders have been working on impulse control and learning to pause and think before they act. Fifth grade learned about empathy—what it is, how it feels, and how we show it. And in middle school, we've been focusing on taking care of our mental health through healthy habits and self-awareness.



Keep Christ in Christmas

Poster Judging Fact Sheet

RULES

Poster must reflect the theme of *Keep Christ in Christmas*.

Each poster should be the original work (including concept, layout, slogan and any visual images) of a single person.

Poster should be approximately 11x17 inches in size. If pastels, chalk or charcoal are used, the poster must be laminated or covered with clear plastic. Posters may be in color or black and white.

Each poster must be submitted with a Knights of Columbus "Keep Christ in Christmas" Poster Contest entry form.

The name and grade of the person entering the poster should be included on the back of the poster.

All entries become the property of the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council. **Posters will not be returned.**

JUDGING

Judging should be done by teams composed of students, Knights, teachers, administrators, Chaplin, Pastor, etc. In keeping with the theme of giving young people the opportunity to develop their own feeling towards Christmas and our savior Jesus Christ, young people should be included in all phases of the judging process.

A **100 point scoring system** will be used to determine the winner.

30 Points: Slogan — How clearly is the theme presented?

30 Points: Visuals — How well do the visuals convey the message?

40 Points: Overall impact — How effective was the poster in capturing your attention and causing you to reflect on the topic?
