New Tuition and Fees Refund Policy for the 2025-2026 School Year

For any enrolled student who withdraws from school, the refund policy is as follows:

- May I to July 31 100%
- August I to October 31 75%
- January I to March 31 25%
- November I to December 31 50%
- April I to end of the school year 0%

*Fees (student and security) are refundable until July 31.

Extended Care Registration for the 2025-2026 School Year

It is now time to register your child(ren) for the St. Alphonsus Extended Care Program for the **2025-2026** school year. We will be implementing a new online sign up and payment platform called Cheddar Up. You will be able to fill out necessary forms and make monthly recurring payments through Cheddar Up. Please make note of the following:

I. There is a one time registration fee **PER FAMILY**. Please only add to cart once.

2. The monthly recurring payments (either for morning care, aftercare, or both) will be **PER CHILD**. Please add to cart for each child.

3. Make sure to add a family registration fee (add only once) **AND** a recurring monthly fee choice (either mornings, afternoons, or both) to your cart before you check out.

4. Exception: Drop-in care will only pay their registration fee at this time.

Summer Reading 2025-2026

Dear Parents,

We're excited to share some updates to our summer reading program for the 2025–2026 school year that we believe will make the experience more engaging and meaningful for both students and teachers.

Students entering 3rd–8th grade will read two books over the summer: one required title and one book of their choice that is appropriate for their reading level, based on their 4th nine weeks STAR scores. This approach allows students to enjoy more personalized reading while still engaging with a shared text that will connect the class in the fall.

There will no longer be a separate summer testing schedule. Instead, when students return to school, they'll take an AR test on their chosen book, and their class will dive into fun and enriching activities based on the required reading.

To help select a book at the appropriate level, families can use <u>arbookfind.com</u>.

We're confident that this refreshed approach will help foster a love of reading and build a stronger classroom community from day one!


Drop-Off:

TIPS FOR TEACHING KIDS ABOUT INTERNET SAFETY

Be Clear About What Is And Isn't Okay

It's important to be very clear about what you expect from your child when they are online. This will help your child know exactly what they should and shouldn't do. Here are some ideas:

- Talk with your child about which websites/apps they are allowed to use. If possible, put a parental block on the websites/apps that you don't want them to use.
- Remind your child to never share private information like their full name, address, passwords, phone number, or even their upcoming plans.
- Discourage your child from talking to strangers online.
- Talk with your child about cyberbullying. Remind them to never be mean or post embarrassing things about others. If they see any of this happening, encourage them to tell you or another adult right away.

Monitor Internet Use

Helping your child use the internet safely is not just a one-time conversation. Here are some tips to help you monitor your child's internet use:

- Use the internet together. Model the behavior you want them to practice when using the internet.
- Talk to your children about what apps or websites they are using. Research the apps to see what potential dangers there are for those specific apps. Talk to your child about ways they can stay safe. Keep in mind that apps change frequently, so stay up to date on the information.
- Pay attention to how much time your child is spending on the internet. Remind your child that it is healthy to take breaks from their device(s). Help your child find screen-free activities that they enjoy, or that you can do together as a family. Ideas include playing board games, going on a walk, cooking or baking, or playing a sport.

Make A Plan

Together with your child, come up with a plan that answers the following questions:

- · How much time will they spend on the internet?
- What apps/websites can they access?
- What will they do if they see unsafe/inappropriate things?
